Young Football Played Dies After Collapsing

SURGERY

The boy's father, Donald, said his son underwent surgery for head injuries within an hour after he was admitted to hospital.

Coroner Edmond Jorre de St. Jorre said Tuesday night it was unlikely that an inquest will be held, but he will have a coroner's inquiry.

Mr. St. Jorre said that a post mortem showed the young football player died from a subdural hemorrhage.

He also said he has asked the city police to investigate the circumstances of the injuries.

The coach said the youngster was in tremendous physical condition and a great competitor.

He said it is the first time to his knowledge that juvenile football in Canada has had a fatality.

RITES

Mr. Hindle said the game in which the youngster was hurt had been a good clean contest.

The Hornets have been in operation for eight years and play in the Vancouver Island Juvenile Football League.

Allan MacDonald was born in Zeballos and last June graduated from Victoria's Mount Douglas High School.

He is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Donald Mac-Donald, three sisters, Donna, Darlene and Diane, and two brothers, Michael and Donald Junior.

Prayers will be said in Sacred Heart Church, Nelthorpe Street, at 8 p.m. Thursday and mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. the following morning with Rev. Jan Planeta officiating. McCall Bros. funeral directors are in charge of arrangements.
